Dear Mr. Hevera,

Thank you for your email below, enquiry attached and email of 13th January 2012.

To answer your questions, the Legislation which covers the sharing of personal information with the Local Government Ombudsman is both: [Section 35 of Data Protection Act 1998](#) and s.29 of the Local Government Act 1974.

The Local Government Ombudsman has extensive statutory powers to require information about relevant persons. Where disclosure is required to be made by Local Government legislation it will not be in breach of the DPA 1998. This would be the case even though the data subject may object to the disclosure or may not have provided any specific permission to the LGO to disclose the information. Therefore, the Royal Borough provided the information that was requested by the LGO, which included information about your medical condition.

I believe that Nadia Husain provided you with information relating to the LGO's powers in her response to your query 5th January 2012.
